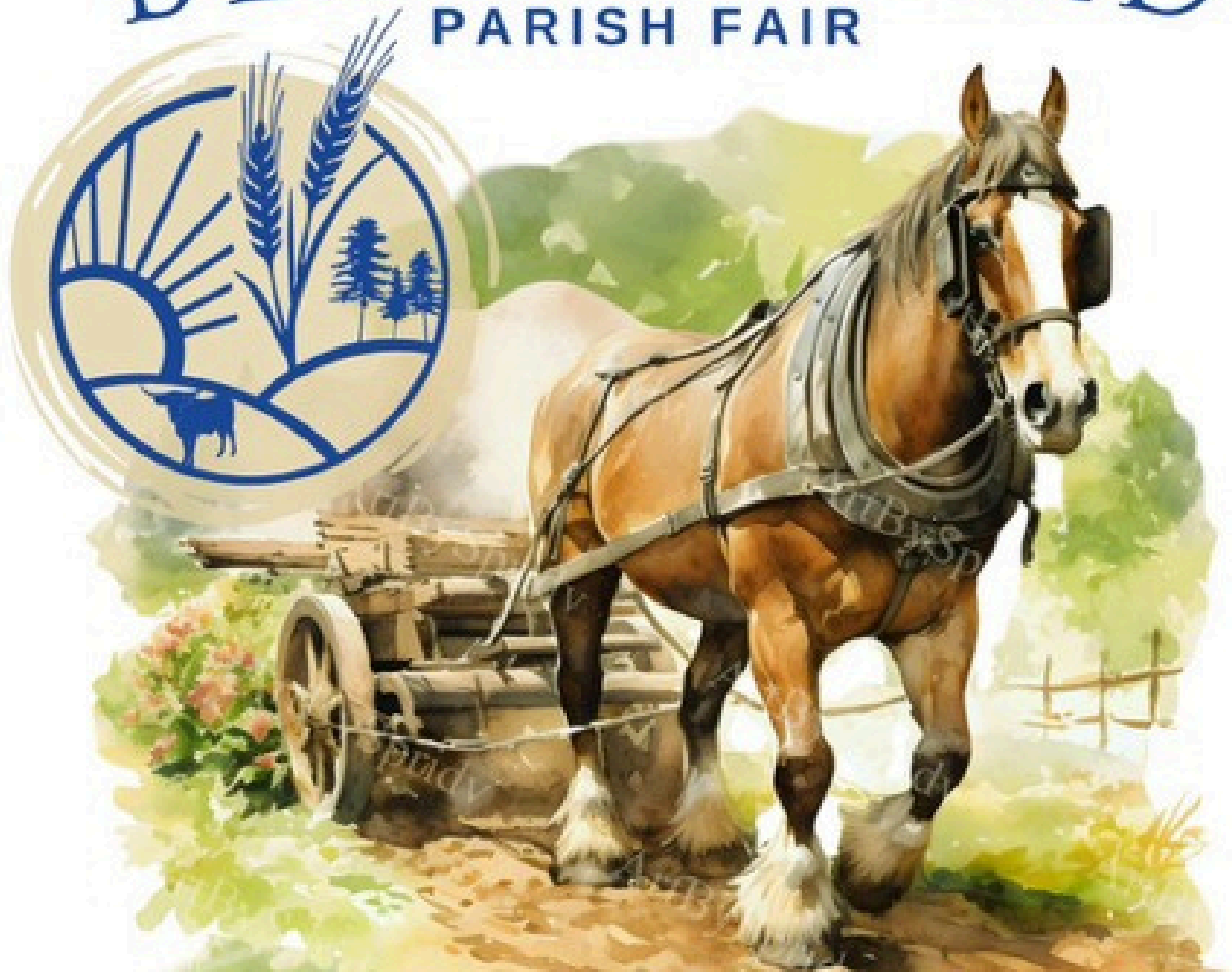

THE BEAUREGARD PARISH FAIR ASSOCIATION, ITS DIRECTORS AND OFFICER, AND ANY DESIGNATED FAIR WORKERS NOR ANY OF THEM INDIVIDUALLY SHALL BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY LOSS, DAMAGE OR INJURY OF ANY CHARACTER, TO ANY PERSON, ANIMAL, OR ARTICLE WHILE IT IS ON THE BEAUREGARD PARISH FAIR GROUNDS, OR AT ANY OTHER TIME OR PLACE.

The Beauregard Parish Fair Association nor the County Agent’s Office will no longer be responsible for tagging and sending items to the State Fair in Shreveport during the middle of October. Our decision was based on the care of the parish exhibit items once they were in the possession of the State Fair in Shreveport. All tagging and transportation of the exhibits to the State Fair in Shreveport will be the responsibility of each individual exhibitor. When items are picked up on Monday, October 6, 2025 after Parish Fair, tagging materials will be available if exhibitors wish to take the personal responsibility of entering and transporting their own exhibits to the State Fair in Shreveport. In lieu of items not being taken to State Fair the Beauregard Parish Fair Association will be offering a Sweepstakes, Best In Show Award for each section in youth work and adult division. This Sweepstakes will be an award of \$10 above and beyond any other award (s) received in each section.

**NOTICE:** Fair Personnel have the right to refuse any entry that they do not feel worthy of exhibit. Judges and fair personnel have the right to add items into entry as deemed necessary.

GENERAL RULES

- All exhibitors must be residents of Beauregard Parish or Ward Seven of Vernon Parish, referred to as Ward Nine.
- All exhibitors must be the property of the exhibitor and produced or domiciled in Beauregard Parish or Ward Nine.
- Exhibits will be accepted on Monday, September 29th, 2025.

According to INSTRUCTION FOR ENTERING ARTICLES or specific instructions given under PREMIUM LIST DEPARTMENT of this catalog. No entries in the Culinary Department shall be accepted after noon Monday, September 29th, 2025.

All school and ward exhibits must be in the care of one or more attendants.

Quantities specified in premium lists must be strictly adhered to in preparing exhibits for entry.

Exhibits not listed in the catalog will be accepted for exhibition purposes only.

Interference with the work of the judges will bar exhibitor from competition.

Superintendents in each division will assist judges in performing their work, but have no influence in making awards.

Judging in the Culinary Department begins at 1:00 PM on Monday, September 29th, 2025. Please clear the area so the Judges, Clerks, and Superintendents may move about freely. The Exhibit Buildings will be closed Tuesday, September 30th, 2025, to all except authorized persons assisting with judging. These areas will open to the public at official opening time.

JUDGES DECISIONS WILL BE FINAL IN ALL CATEGORIES!!!!!!!

Every exhibit **MUST** be in place in all departments and classes until Sunday, October 5th, 2025, except where special instructions are printed under the specific Department section of this catalog. Persons removing exhibits prior to Sunday October 5th, 2025, will forfeit all prizes, and awards and will be barred from exhibiting in future fairs in Beauregard Parish.

**EXHIBITS MUST BE PICKED UP SUNDAY, OCTOBER 5th, 2025 BETWEEN 2 P.M. & 5 P.M. OR MONDAY, OCTOBER 6th, 2025, BETWEEN 9:00 A.M. AND 1:00 P.M. EXHIBITS NOT PICKED UP THIS DATE WILL BE DESTROYED!!! INSTRUCTIONS OF ENTERING EXHIBITS

1. Use the entry form found in the back of this catalog or a photocopy of the form in this catalog. List the articles you wish to exhibit with the complete PREMIUM NUMBER as it is listed in the catalog. There will be some extra forms available on opening day at station marked "ENTRY FORMS" and in livestock barn receiving area. Please list livestock entries on a separate entry form from entries placed in other departments. This entry tag is how you get paid. It must be completed in the name of the person entering item to assure proper payment.
2. LIVESTOCK ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ON SATURDAY, September 29th, 2025 FROM 2:00 P.M. UNTIL 5:00 P.M. ENTRIES ONLY-NO ANIMALS SHALL BE BROUGHT IN AT THIS TIME. LIVESTOCK ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED MONDAY, September 29th, 2025 8:00 A.M.-5:30 P.M.
3. NO ENTRY IN ANY DEPARTMENT WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT A COMPLETED ENTRY FORM AND A COMPLETED ENTRY TAG!!!

7. An exhibitor may enter only ONE of each premium number. If an item does NOT have a premium number it must go before the chairwoman to be accepted. If an item has a premium number it cannot be entered into "ANY OTHER" category. ANY OTHER PREMIUM number is the exception to the rule. Entrant may enter more than one dissimilar item in this category. If there is a question, the chairwoman must be consulted.
8. You will receive ONE FAIR ENTRY TICKET for each ARTICLE listed on your entry form. \*With a MAXIMUM of 13 FAIR ENTRY TICKETS PER EXHIBITOR.
9. Using same black ink pen, complete one tag for each article, writing number of the tag in far right hand column of entry form and attaching tag to article. PLEASE NOTE: Department, Section and Class lines on the tags are for your information only. You may write the word "Adult" if you are entering in the adult department- "Canning" if you are entering canning and "Vegetable" if the item is a Vegetable. This is for your information to know where to carry the exhibit to have it admitted or where to pick it up from your study- the Premium Number will identify the item for judging!

10. Take the tagged article AND your entry form to the department superintendent who will initial your form, tear off the CLAIM CHECK (must have to claim your article after the fair), give the claim check to you, and accept your article for exhibit.
11. After all articles are turned over to superintendents of departments, return to station marked "TICKETS" Present your entry form to the person there. You will Receive admission tickets for each entry initialed by the Department Superintendent.

- No growing plants may be entered for competition, but may be used for decorative purposes.
- The Director or responsible person will be in charge of entries in this department and diligence will be exercised to prevent damage, but in no case will the Fair Association assume responsibility for damage.
- ENTRIES IN THIS DEPARTMENT MUST HAVE BEEN GROWN OR MANUFACTURED IN THE WARD BY THE EXHIBITOR AND MUST BE CORRECTLY NAMED.
- Ward Director, or the person designated in charge of the ward booth, has the right to reject an unworthy exhibit and those exhibits not grown in the ward. To promote agriculture education, diligence should be used to accurately enter items with the correct premium numbers. Judges will not make awards to improperly labeled items. Every exhibit must remain in place until Monday, October 6th, 2025, and if not picked up on that date will be destroyed.

- Agricultural Booths will be scored as follows:
1. General Appearance 15 Points
2. Educational Feature 35 Points
- A. Thoroughness and Information 10
- B. Simplicity and Effectiveness Points
- C. Educational Value 10 Points
3. Agricultural Products: 50 Points
- A. Quality of Products 25 Points  
(Number of 1st, 2nd, & 3rd Place Exhibits)
- B. Variety of Products 25 Points



In judging the EDUCATIONAL FEATURE, the judge will consider:

- 1. Agricultural Importance
- 2. Minimum of Printed Matter
- 3. Simplicity (Ease of Understanding)
- 4. Thoroughness of lesson portrayed
- 5. General Attractiveness

In judging DECORATION AND ARRANGEMENT, judges will consider:

- 1. Attractive appearance of the background and the table
- 2. Symmetry and color harmony of the display
- 3. Free from excess clutter
- 4. Uniformity, where desirable

In judging AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS, judges will consider:

- 1. How well the product represents the agricultural production of the world
- 2. U.S. Grades shall govern quality
- 3. Relative importance of products displayed

1. All AMATEUR gardeners in Beauregard Parish and Ward 9 are invited to submit entries.
2. All entries must be made between 9:00 A.M. And 5:00 P.M. on Monday, September 29th, 2025 and must be accompanied by a completed entry form (attached to this book or photo copied from this book) and completed entry tag (available at entry table at the fair grounds).
3. All entries must have been grown by the exhibitor. Pot plants must have been in exhibitor's possession at least six months prior to show.
4. All entries must be correctly named by the exhibitor.
5. Because of staging problems overly large specimens such as elephant-ear leaves, Magnolia branches and thorny plants such as pyracantha will not be accepted.
6. Wildflowers such as sunflowers, cornflowers, wild morning-glory and water hyacinths may not be entered.
7. No artificial plant material and no dried specimens will be accepted.
8. Plants on the Native Plant List must have been garden-grown. Sarracenia (Pitcher Plant) is an endangered species and cannot be shown.
9. No entry may compete for more than one premium.
10. No substitutions will be accepted Tuesday morning, September 30th, 2025, EXCEPT one-day bloomers such as Hibiscus, Althea, Hemerocallis (Day lily) and Roses.
11. Containers will not be furnished for any entries no matter what kind or size. EXHIBITORS MUST PROVIDE CONTAINER AND IT MUST BE ANY CLEAR GLASS CONTAINER OR ADEQUATE SIZE FOR ENTRY SUBMITTED.
12. Pot plants must be in clean, standard pots not more than fourteen inches across inside top. Plants must be clean and well groomed, but cannot be oiled or waxed.
13. All pot plants in Section 1, Flowering Potted Plants, must be in bloom, berry or fruit, or a combination of these.
14. Entry Committee may refuse to accept entries which do not conform to rules of the show.
15. Judging will be done by competent horticulturists.
16. Entries must stay in place until Sunday, October 5th, 2025 -2:00 P.M. Until 5 P.M. and must be removed between 9:00 A.M. And 1:00 P.M. Monday, October 6th, 2025.

# RULES, REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES

PLEASE READ AND UNDERSTAND ALL RULES AS THERE MAY BE CHANGES FROM LAST YEAR! PROSECUTED TO THE FULLEST!  
ALL RABBITS MUST BE TATOORED.

(Rosepine)

Exhibitor must live in Beauregard Parish or Ward 9 or must attend a Beauregard Parish School and animals must be housed in Beauregard Parish or Ward 9 in order to be eligible to show at the Beauregard Parish Fair. Every animal must be housed with exhibitor.

All animals entered in the show must have been in the exhibitors possession and care no later than October 1st of the current fair year.

POULTRY TESTING - All Birds MUST be tested for Poultry Diseases. Testing will take place September 21, 2025 - 1:00 P.M. - 5:00 P.M. & September 22, 2025 - 3:00-7:00 P.M.

All animals shall remain on exhibit until release time, which is at 10:30 P.M. Saturday, October 4th, 2025. Animals that leave early are subject to having awards forfeited.

Youth or Junior shall be defined as any exhibitor meeting 4-H or FFA membership age requirements or younger.

It is the exhibitor's or parents responsibility to enter the animal, showmanship, and other contests; and to get prospect and/or market animals weighed at the designated times.

Animals not properly cared for will be subject to disqualification.

Exhibitor's are responsible to feeding and watering their animals.

All animals will be exhibited in the Show Ring by the Exhibitor of Record except Tie Rack Cattle, an exhibitor having more than one animal to exhibit in a class, or the exhibitor becomes ill.

No single animal may be exhibited more than once, except for champion drives and showmanship.

Prospect or Market classes for sheep, goats, or swine are for females and castrated males. (NO INTACT MALES).

Market goats must be dehorned, disbudded or polled.

Any scurs or horn structuring must be blunt and not exceed one inch in length. Goats not meeting dehorning requirements shall be placed in commercial class and will not be eligible to compete for Champion or Reserve Champion.

ANYONE CAUGHT STEALING ANIMALS FROM THE BEAUREGARD FAIR WILL BE

All market goats and sheep must not show evidence of permanent incisors.

Bucks/ Rams must be registered but will not be allowed on grounds until Saturday morning.

All animals used in showmanship must have been entered and/or shown in the Youth Division. PeeWee showmanship will be included for each species. They may exhibit an animal entered by another youth or entered by themselves in the BPF.

Market Animals entered in State Fair of LA can come into fair on Friday and released Saturday P.M.

Livestock Wristbands will be issued for all species except Rabbits. Rabbit exhibitors will be given passes if rabbits are required to stay.

MAX of 4 bands/passes per family.

Nohay (including hay bags) is allowed in the barn. Tie racks are provided, outside the barn, for exhibitor use.

Feeding and watering of cattle must be done at the outside tie racks or even in the wash rack if need be.

All cattle should be back in the barn by 6:00 P.M. each evening, so that fairgoers can view them. After all, these are the people who pay to get into the fair and this is the money that is used to pay the livestock premiums. No dogs allowed in the barn.

Groom animals in the designated areas. Do not groom animals in the tie areas.

All grooming equipment, feed buckets and water buckets, and other items must be removed from the aisles before 6 p.m. nightly.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to cleanup their pens and tie-spaces. The Fair will provide trash cans and etc. to help in keeping the barn clean.

Do not put manure in the trash cans. It goes outside to the area designated for it. Wheel barrows and shovels will be provided by the Beauregard Fair Association to haul the manure.
